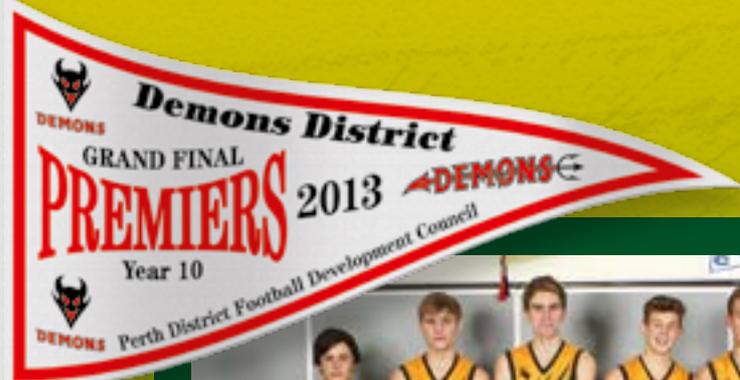




SOUTH PERTH JUNIOR FOOTBALL CLUB

Treasurer's Annual Summary

The 2014 season has been another financially positive year for the South Perth Junior Football Club (SPJFC). With this building of the club's financial position, the ability of SPJFC to cover any future large financial commitment with the proposed new clubrooms at Ernest Johnson Oval has been greatly enhanced. The club has also increased the support to social activities with the inaugural sundowner, added to the family club day and parent social night. Our club continues to improve and grow the club's equipment and provide new opportunities to our junior footballers all resulting from this healthy financial position.

The following summarises key incomes and outgoings for the year.

- Current registration fees cover direct player costs and basic running of the club. This includes insurance for players and property, Perth Football Club registration, trophies, annual year book (with all team photos), umpire fees, first aid supplies and training, district carnivals, coach's accreditation and development, food and drink at SPJFC player events and oval line marking.
- Sponsorship remains the key to our club's positive financial position and without the generous financial provision of our many sponsors we would not be able to offer the high standard of equipment and the many activities to our football community. Please support all our sponsors as they are great local businesses within our community:
 - **Ian Hutchison Real Estate** remains the principal club sponsor, continuing their loyal support.
 - **Como IGA** has provided generous financial and material assistance to the club throughout the year.
 - **Como Physiotherapy Clinic** continued their physio support with the club.
 - **Harvey Norman Belmont** was this year's Annual Parent's Social Night Event sponsor, providing great prizes and auction items.
 - **Christina's Restaurant** Vic Park made tasty salads and sponsored the Season's Opening Family Sundowner.
- The "Stingrays 100 Club" membership was down on last year. However, is still a very successful fund-raising for our club and we greatly appreciate those members who have annually donated \$100. It is a fabulous way for parents, extended family, friends and local businesses to provide financial support on a small scale to our junior football club, particularly for those who cannot volunteer their time or services. So please come and join in the new season!!!
- Sponsorship was also supplemented by government grants. SPJFC was successful in the Community Sporting Club Equipment Subsidy Scheme offered by our State Government – Department of Sport and Recreation and received \$500. We were also awarded a \$500 Armando Sport voucher for hosting and actively participating in a very successful Perth

Demons Coach Training session. There was also record participation in the government's KidSport initiative (17 in total), which provides financial support for player registration to families in need.

- We have increased the social events with the introduction of the Season Opening Family Sundowner as well as the Annual Parent's Social Night. The Sundowner was a tremendous success with many families enjoying the afternoon and with the great support of Christina's Restaurant, Como IGA, Claytons Butchers and Liquor Barons Angelo St, the club made a small profit. A change of venue and entertainment for the Parent's Social Night resulted in around 130 parents having a wonderful evening overlooking the beautiful Swan River and Perth City lights. The Family Club Day uses a large portion of the social fund-raising budget to provide a great fun day for the players to end the season on a high. Overall the social activities and associated fund-raising will be adding more than \$2,000 for the season towards the financial health of our club. So thank-you to all the families that have supported these social events!
- Our canteen continues to provide a steady source of revenue and is well supported by all SPJFC teams, from the younger and larger Auskick group right through to the Year 10s team.

I thoroughly enjoy being apart of the SPJFC and being involved with the



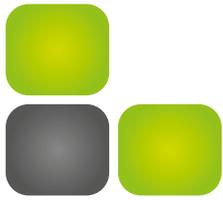

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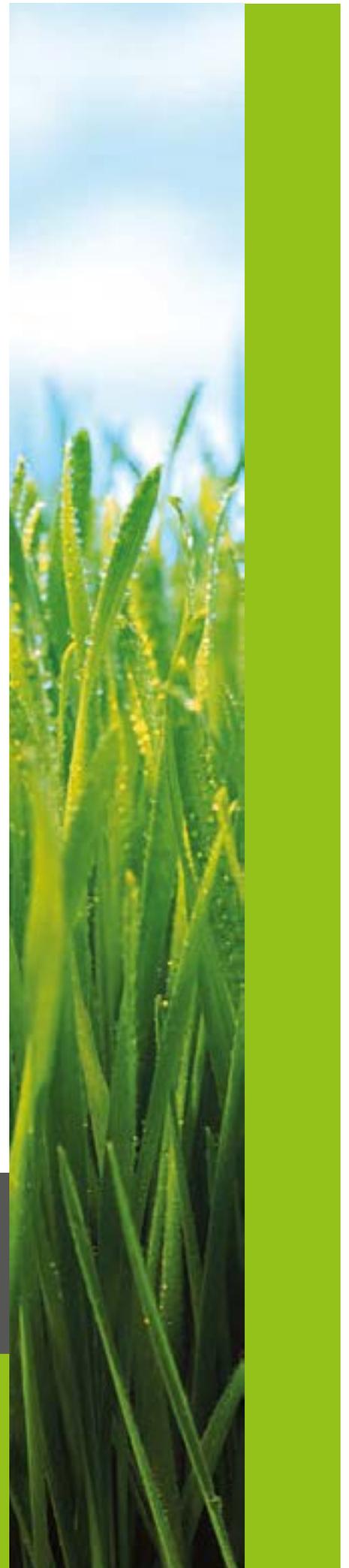
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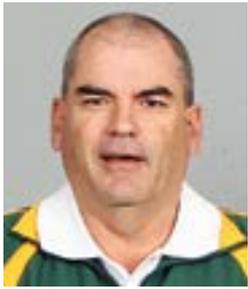
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Life Member – Darryl Sinclair



Football has always been part of Darryl Sinclair's life. Growing up he played his junior football in the East Perth District for Christian Brothers College Bedford and in the Claremont District for North Beach. He participated in 3 winning and 3 losing premierships during his junior football days. He continued with his football, playing with Floreat Amateurs for many years.

During this period he also discovered a love of umpiring and along the way officiated as the central umpire for 14 WAFCL Grand finals.

Due to his dedication to umpiring Darryl received the Coaching Umpiring Award in 2002 and was made a Legend of the WACFL in 2003. It was in 2003 that his association with SPJFC began.

Darryl acted as Coach or Assistant coach for the next 7 years. Both Darryl's boys played for South Perth with Ryan Sinclair achieving 101 games and a Year 12 premiership in 2009, while his other son Kyle Sinclair played 166 games, played in the 2011 Year 12 premiership and also became a life member of SPJFC in 2011. Darryl's wife Fiona was team manager for the 2009 Year 12 premiership team.

Darryl has been part of the SPJFC committee since 2005 and has continued through to this season. From 2008 to 2011 and again this season he has acted as our Coaching Coordinator.

In 2010 he was presented with a Service Award by our club and then 2012 he was made a Life Member of the South Perth JFC. An award that he is very proud to have achieved.

Through this period Darryl continued his association with umpiring and was the WAFL Umpire Coach / Manager from 2007 to 2013 and today is the current WAFL Umpire Manager.

South Perth JFC has been extremely lucky to have a person of Darryl's caliber and experience associated with our club over such a period of time. We hope his involvement with our club continues for many more seasons to come.

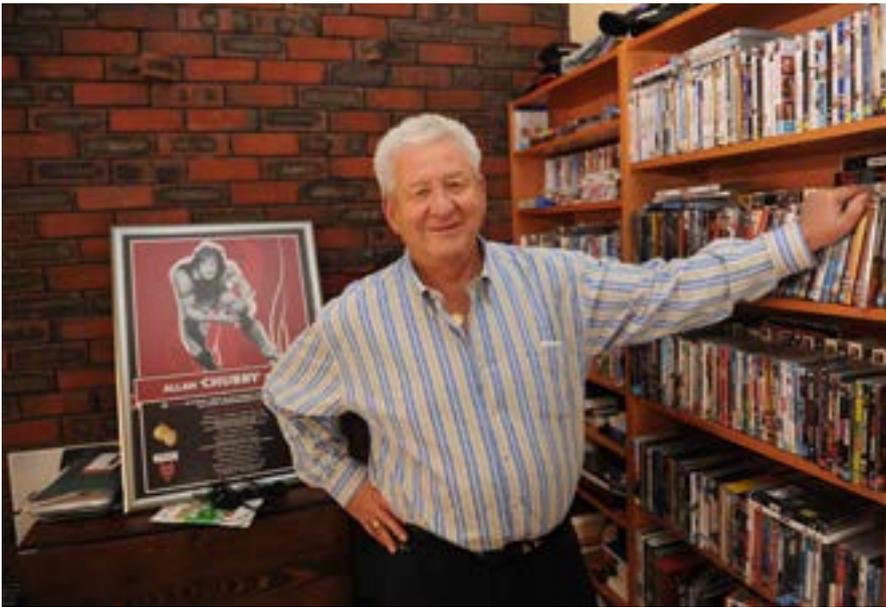

Club Patron – Allan Stiles



I started my football career at the South Perth Junior Football club at the age of 8 in the Under 14s team the 'Mosquitoes'. We played in yellow cotton shirts with a green cotton number and I wore number 4. There was no real competition, just a march past and knock out (round robin) day. We received our first jumpers in 1959 and they had a yellow background with a green stripe, green around the armhole and a green collar with white numbers.

During my time at the Club I played in three Premiership sides and in every Perth Combined side from when I was 12 until I left. I won my first trophy in 1956 for only missing 2 nights of training. My mother used to work at the cinemas and I was

meant to be home by 5 o'clock and I was always in trouble, I didn't tell her where I was or that I was even playing football until I brought home my trophy!

I was exceptionally lucky at South Perth to have very good coaches and good teams.

In 1965 I went to Perth Football Club and won a Premiership and Fairest and Best in their Colts. I made my League debut in 1966 and won the Reserves Fairest and Best in 1967 and 1968 and in 1968 won the Prendergast Medal, Fairest and Best in the competition, and a Reserves Premiership. I went on to play 150 games, three State games and in the 1970 game versus South Australia won the Simpson Medal. I was made a Legend of the Club in 2009. I retired from football at the age of 27 and went onto a very good career in Football Media.

At the age of 19 I started with the old Grand Theatre Company in their Advertising Department working my way up to Advertising Manager and then General Manager. In 1987 I ventured east for a few years as Managing Director of a film distribution company called Seven Keys. I then returned to Grand Cinemas and with my cousin Colin started the Grand Theatre Company of today. Grand Cinemas now operate six sites with 39 screens and are the second largest independent cinema group in Australia. I was awarded Australian Cinema Pioneer of the Year in 2003, WA Cinema Pioneer of the Year in 2010 and am Chairman of the Motion Picture Benevolent Fund.

I am honoured and humbled to be the inaugural Patron of the South Perth Junior Football Club.

Overall an outstanding experience for all players, coaches and parents involved in this ongoing club event.



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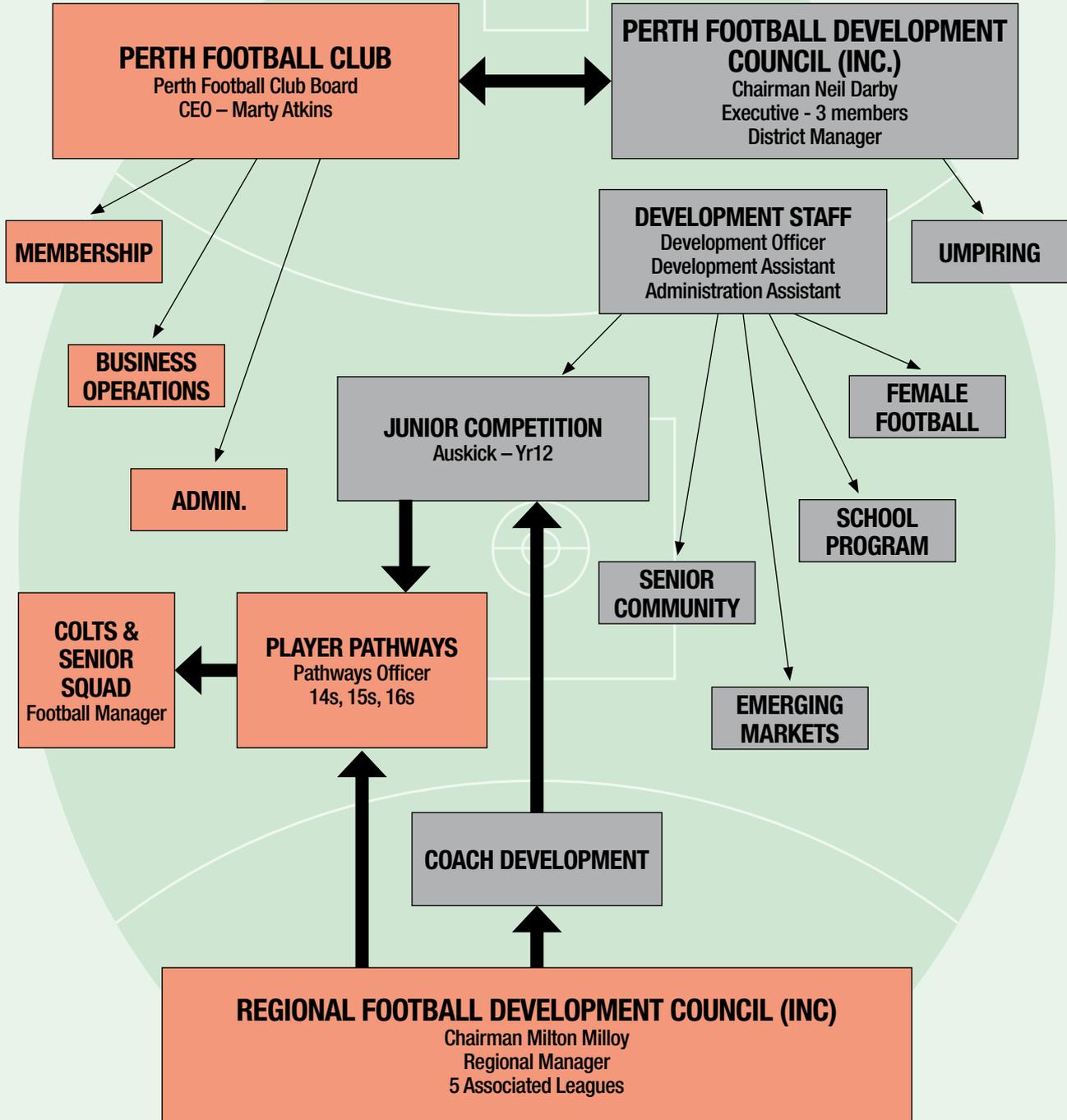

In 2014, the South Perth Junior Football Club has been represented well at WAFL Level with eight former players making debuts for the Perth Football Club in the Colts' team. In addition to these players at Colts' level, South Perth JFC had three players at Reserves level, four at League level and 3 former junior coaches involved in coaching at the club.

Jared Bell, a former premiership player with South Perth, was a standout performer at colts' level, joining the program late into the pre-season he took all before him, holding down a key defensive post, and often beating the opposition key forward. Rewarded for his consistent performances, Jared made his reserves debut in round 20 against Claremont. Jared averaged over 20 possessions at over 80% efficiency to be ranked number 2 in the competition for players with over 150 possessions – this is elite level.

Daniel Horan played at South Perth from Auskick to U13s before returning for the senior year in the 16s/17s competition. Having an interpreted season with a few injuries, when Daniel was able to get consistent time on field, he showed great class with his disposal and competitiveness.

Thomas Glasfurd from Moora played for three years at South Perth and transitioned well to Colts football. Playing in a variety of positions during the season, Tom was best suited in a midfield role where he used his stronger body to break through congestion.

Joel Hooper who played under Sam Mainwaring for much of his time at South Perth ended up at Perth care of a transfer from West Perth. With a lack of tall players in this year's colts program, Joel fitted in well shouldering much of the ruck work.

His improvement in this area was terrific as an often undersized player in a difficult position. His improved fitness assisted in getting around the ground taking a number of intercept marks and contributing in score involvements.

George Keith played all of his football at South Perth before moving to Vic Park for his 17s year. As a younger age player George showed great natural ability to read the game and find himself in good position. He is a confident player who possesses good skills. Unfortunately George missed a large period of the season with family travel which limited his opportunities, however will be a bright prospect as a late age player in 2015.

The PSA contingent of players Clint Chivers and Bradley Pattison (Wesley) and Josh Seigert (Aquinas) all showed positive signs with their limited opportunities at Colts level. Having all played together with former coach Beau Wardman, they will become regular players in 2015. Josh a former Club Captain and Brad, a former District Best and Fairest, along with Clint have the base skills and football knowledge to progress through the WAFL system.

It is hoped that all of these players can progress to senior football in the coming years and represent the South Perth Junior Football Club at league level for the Perth Football Club.

Year 10

The 2014 season is my third year of coaching at the South Perth Junior Football Club. I coached one of the Year 9 teams in 2012 and the Year 10 team in 2013. After two successful seasons, with the South Perth Year 9 Green team winning a premiership in 2012 and the South Perth Year 10 team winning the premiership in 2013, a main goal for the Year 10 South Perth players this season was to achieve more success for the South Perth Junior Football Club.

The Year 10 season involves playing games against the Year 10 East Perth teams in a cross district competition format (such as teams from Noranda, Ellenbrook, Mt Lawley, Ballajura, Mt Hawthorn and Morely). This is the first time many players has been involved in a cross district competition (except for Zareth Roe, Declan Rado, Ty Gent and Austin Siviour who played Year 10 last year).

At our first training session in mid-April, the Year 10 team started with a squad of only 20 players. As the weeks progressed towards Round 1, the squad slowly grew with new players joining the team.

The Year 10 South Perth team was essentially a new squad of players at the start of the season, with many players not playing football together previously. About 12 players came from South Perth Year 9 Green last year, about 6 players from South Perth Year 9 Gold, about 7 players were new to the South Perth Junior Football Club and 4 players were from last year's Year 10 team. So a big challenge, initially, was to bring the whole squad together as a single football team as quickly as possible, in order to achieve team success.

In Round 6, the players welcomed Tere Teio-Yarran and Chilton Yarran into the team. Both Tere and Chilton have been important members of the team since they joined.

The team has relied on many "fill-in" players during the season to help out when player numbers were low. So a big thanks to all those players that have played on a fill-in basis. By Round 14 this season, 36 individual players have played at least one game for the Year 10 team.

The squad now consists of 29 regular players that have qualified to play finals.

The season started very well with a strong win over Vic Park in Round 1. The game was played on a Friday night, under lights at Brownes Stadium. From that initial win, the Year 10 team went on to win 12 consecutive games. The team's first loss came in Round 13 during the school holidays, when our Year 10 team, with only 16 players, played against a full strength Mt Lawley team.

After Round 14, the Year 10 team had 13 wins and 1 loss and is sitting 3 games clear on top of the Perth / East Perth Year 10 cross district competition ladder.

All the players should be very proud of their high quality football this season. The entire team adopted and successfully implemented a new game plan – a running possession style of play, with handball and run.

One of the biggest challenges this year has been managing players with injury and soreness during the season. Many players in the Year 10 team play PSA football on Saturday and then a football game for South Perth on Sunday. In addition, our team has several Boarders. So during school holidays or on long weekends these players, generally, have been unavailable to play.

Unfortunately, a number of players in our Year 10 team have received long term injuries (mostly from non-South Perth football incidents) during the season. This has resulted in many players being unavailable to play many games throughout the year. Hamish McInnes played in Round 1, but has missed the entire season due to an accident while on school holidays. John Dagnall also played in Round 1, but then missed 6 games due to a stake-boarding accident while on school holidays. Jake McClelland also played in Round 1, but then missed the next 11 games due to a leg injury. Bailey Kentish missed 6 weeks due to a fractured finger in Round 5 and has now missed a further 2 games due to a hyper extended knee in Round 12. Quinten Munns has only managed to play 5 games this season due to a sore back. Ben Lawrance fractured his thumb while playing Wesley football, resulting Ben being out for 6 weeks. Flynn Coaker recently injured his leg playing Wesley football, which will see Flynn miss the remainder of the season. Tere Teio-Yarran fractured his toe while on tour with the Flying Boomerang's squad, resulting in Tere missing the past 3 games.

Fingers crossed that the Year 10 team has a full team of fit players for the remaining two games and for finals.

It is important to acknowledge the great effort by Russell White as team manager this season. Russell does a mountain of work as team manager on match day and during the week. Great effort Russell. I also want to thank Richard Lobb as the team runner this season. There are also many other volunteers that help out on game day, including Anna McClelland, Andrew Brass, Lindy and Steve Dagnall, Brenton Siviour, Richard Hodson, Martin Tilsed, John Prince, Tony Noll, Alison Rado and Hayley Lawrance for doing important tasks like goal umpiring, boundary, interchange, running water, time keeping and scoreboard and game day setting up.

The whole team should be very proud of their efforts so far. There are just a few home and away games to go and then finals. And hopefully more success for the Club.

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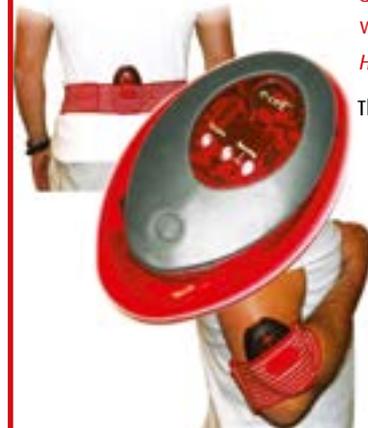

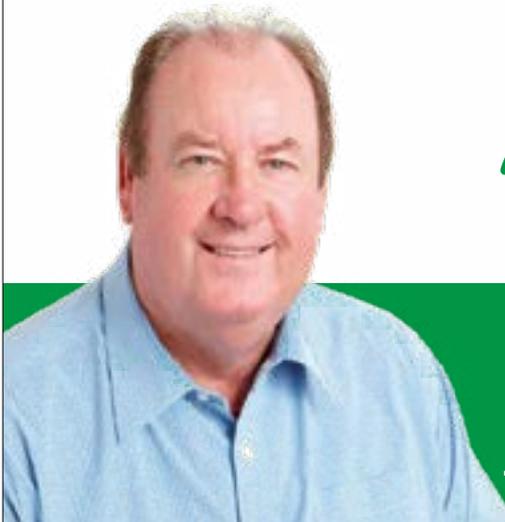

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Why do you Coach?

Have you ever sat down and really thought about why you coach? As a coach of junior football it is a very important question to answer. Most of us do it because we have our own child involved in the sport and it is a chance to connect with them and also their friends. In essence we want to do it. It's a choice. It is crucial though that you do it because you want to make it an enjoyable and challenging experience for the players.

So what should I be doing as the coach?

Taking training and conducting match day operations are the prime roles. But whether you know it or not you are a role model, a teacher and a huge influence on whether the players under your guidance continue in the game beyond your coaching involvement.

Most coaches I've found want to teach young players about the game as they believe it should be played. Fundamentally you want to improve their skills and how they can implement their skills in a game so it links with the rest of the team and there is some system of playing that is evident.

In junior coaching winning is a fact of life. Most of those playing will want to win, but it is not the main reason children chose to play sport. Research has consistently shown they play mainly for the friendships, be they existing or new ones, the enjoyment of the involvement and the development of their skills – they want to get better. If none of these factors are catered for it won't matter if you win, they won't enjoy it and are unlikely to come back next year.

So do coaches coach to win? Of course they will, but it is more important that they try to make each player better and to get the team to display team work with the objective of scoring. In essence that is the game, trying to create ways to score.

However, I believe the best way a coach can observe and assess the team is that the players are trying to do what they have been taught in a competitive game. Seeing their skills, decision making and team work improving is the key goal of a coach. If these improve it will result in goals being scored and possibly the team winning, but the process is more important than the end objective of scoring or winning.

If we worry too much about winning we may hinder certain aspects of a player's

development. We need them to take chances and to extend their skill. If they can play with freedom within structure, and know they will not be punished or chastised for their errors, they will be more responsive to what they are being asked to attempt.



Coaches by nature can be pessimists and get frustrated because errors occur. But we have to accept errors if we want to extend players. If an error occurs we need to look at it and see whether it was a result of a skill deficiency, a decision making choice, or a lack of team play.

If it was skill then more work needs to be done with the player to improve their skill technique. If it was decisional then the player needs to be guided on the options which may have led to a better result. Activities providing practise in specific scenarios requiring this sort of decision making must be part of training. If it didn't fit with the team's style of play explain why it needs to for the benefit of the team. Either way players should be encouraged to keep trying to do these things otherwise they will not improve.

Winning as the only goal is pointless without a series of instructions or steps to help reach the goal of winning. The key is to have them understand that by doing a, b & c they have a chance of playing well enough to win.

Sometimes they may do everything asked and still not win. Generally that is because the team they play are able to do a, b & c better, or the opposition may do "d" which your team is unable to do just yet in their development as individuals and as a team. The key for the coach is to keep working to make a, b & c better and add "d".

As a coach you have a right to demand players do their best no matter what their age. They need to know that in a team game everyone's effort is needed. It is a lack of effort that a coach has a right to be disappointed with when it comes

to coaching. In this scenario the coach must find out why the effort was low? There may be very good reasons such as injury or illness or another issue that has not allowed the player to be at their best.

However when stressing disappointment as a coach, be careful that is not seen to be about you or the work you do, rather that it isn't fair on their teammates who are trying so hard and it puts too much unnecessary pressure on them.

So to get the best outcomes for your players:

- focus on skill development and team play in all aspects of the game – the famous three phases of when we have possession, the opposition have possession, or the ball is neutral,
- maintain a positive attitude and approach,
- encourage and emphasis what you have coached and asked them to do,
- educate and teach when you want to change their behaviour – often errors occur because they don't understand what you are asking of them
- ask them more questions during games and training because they are ultimately the ones playing and have knowledge you may not and which could help you as a coach.

In the end people will always try to do what they get rewarded and praised for no matter how young or old they are.
