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PRESIDENT'S REPORT



The 2018 season has been a season of change. The most significant and long overdue change has been the move to our new facilities at Ernest Johnson (EJ) Reserve. While there has been considerable interest, including from visiting clubs, it should not be underestimated the disruption and time that moving to the new facilities has presented.

When you consider the effort required to run a successful club, like our club, the additional work load has been significant, though we are very fortunate to have a strong volunteer base willing to assist. There have been some challenges and some great learnings that are being addressed as we ultimately move towards making the new facilities feel like home.

The move to the new facilities has not only provided us with facilities the envy of many clubs it has also given us far greater control and flexibility in numerous areas. This along with our strong relationships with the other key tenant the WAFL Umpires and with the City of South Perth places us well for the future. Key initiatives to be delivered before next season will be the installation of a shelter structure to the John McGrath Pavilion and the upgrade of the lights to the ovals. Beyond this we are investigating a more permanent location for the scoreboard, additional seating and the viability of improved interchange facilities.

The success of our club both on and off the field is put into perspective for me when I hear from other club Presidents and all manner of issues they have from a lack of finances and players to parent behaviour. What this tells me is we are working in the right direction but need to continue to engage with our members to improve in all areas to maintain a strong club and culture of success. This is critical to a community football club's ongoing sustainability.

It's not just about what happens on the field but driven by a genuine willingness by everyone involved to pitch in and assist wherever and whenever. For this I sincerely thank everyone who has contributed by volunteering in 2018.

This year saw the initiative of celebrating our Life Members in a special day of football and recognition. It was an outstanding day which I know the Life Members thoroughly enjoyed and it has helped some to return our Club for the first time in a long time. This event will become an annual event. When you think about the success of our pre-season Sundowner and Family Fun Day we now have a few events every season that are very much looked forward to.

The Stingrays are a large club and in 2018 we have had over 450 players register. Once again, our Auskick Co-ordinators Steve Lassam and Mark Major have done an exceptional job in promoting and organising the Auskick program. The changes they have introduced this season such as a Sunday training and game, has driven an increase in our Auskick numbers. Their no fuss approach has ensured the ongoing success of our Auskick program and ensures that our youngest members have an enjoyable start to their football journey.

In the Modified Rules program, Vanessa Wainwright has done an outstanding job in her first year as Registrar. We continue to have strong numbers when compared with other clubs. In both year 3 and 4 we have been able to field 3 teams and in years 5 and 6 two teams. Vanessa, while at times on a steep learning curve, has been a tremendous

support to all teams with the professionalism she has brought to the role.

2018 has seen Brad McKibbin take on the Youth Teams' Registrars role. Brad's expertise and enthusiasm in filling such an important role is greatly appreciated, given the large numbers of boys that are boarders and that have PSA commitments. Across all youth grades we continue to have strong numbers. In 2019 it is exciting to announce that we plan to have a year 11/12 team in the new competition announced by the WAFC recently.

As always, the Club's success is not measured by winning games, but by the level of enjoyment that our members attain from their involvement with the Club, whether that is as players, coaches, managers, Club officials, parents, spectators or volunteers. The game day environment created at our home games by the Coaches, Managers and volunteers ensures that everyone attending has a rewarding and enjoyable experience. I congratulate and thank all the coaches, managers and assistant coaches for the outstanding job you have done this year.

The club has invested significant time and money into the new canteen. Sharon Allen is to be commended for her efforts in setting up the canteen. Due to work commitments Sharon handed the responsibility over to Lisa Carter who has built on the foundations laid by Sharon. A big thank you to both ladies for their hard work and commitment.

At the Stingrays we have a committee whose tireless work needs to be acknowledged. The Committee happily volunteer their time for the benefit of the Club. I cannot thank them enough for the time and energy they put into the club. I can't name everyone but, Mark Longton has been an incredible support for me, always willing to take things on in addition to his duties as a coach. Mark Herbert our Secretary has done another super job, as has our Treasurer Steve Law with his prudent management of club funds. Dave Fare has again done a huge amount of work in all areas to ensure the ongoing success of the club. I am grateful to Daryl Sinclair our Coaching Co-ordinator and Chris Long our Team Manager Co-Ordinator who above all else play important mentoring roles. A big thank you must go to Michele Herbert and Isabelle Perger who have taken on the very busy role of Merchandise Co-ordinators. I also need to make special mention of Al Gray whom this season has taken on responsibly for property. I sincerely thank all our Committee members for their commitment to the ongoing success of the Club.

Looking forward, the Club needs parents to join the committee and participate in the continued success of the Club. It is a great opportunity to renew and bring new energy and excitement to the Club. I encourage anyone who enjoys the environment and opportunities the Club provides to become involved in the Committee and thereby guarantee our future.

TREASURER'S ANNUAL SUMMARY


During the 2018 season the financial position of the South Perth Junior Football Club (SPJFC) has been maintained. The Club supported two annual social activities with the sundowner, and the Family Fun Day. Our Club continues to improve and grow the Club's equipment and provide new opportunities to our junior footballers. The following summarises key incomes and outgoings for the year.

Expenditure will exceed revenue by approximately \$10,000 this year. Additional expenditure is due to moving to the new premises. The cost of moving was less than expected due to an increase in registrations and some costs covered by the City of South Perth. Current registration fees cover fixed costs (insurance for players and property, Perth Football Club registration and levies, trophies, first aid supplies and training, district carnivals, coaches' accreditation and development, oval line marking and website (incl Team App maintenance)). Online payment was compulsory this year and significantly helped to streamline the process. Online administration fees for Sports TG (3.9%) and TeamApp (3.6%) are absorbed by the Club and not passed on to the players.

Other significant expenses are the production of the yearbook, Family Club Day and Best and Fairest Function at the end of season.

The transition to the new canteen facility has enabled the Club to continue to provide a service during the home games. Thank you to Sharon for the work early in the season for getting it up and running and to Lisa and Maria who enable the canteen to run smoothly during the season as well as the team volunteers who help on a weekly basis. The canteen provides a small profit of \$2,000 to \$3,000 each year.

Merchandise (clothing) is a significant expense We have reduced stock levels over the year and over time the costs will be recovered.

SPOTLIGHT ON PAT 'PADDY' DALTON




Pat Dalton, or Paddy as we like to call him, was the youngest of the "Dalton Gang" who started their playing careers right here at South Perth in the early 1950s. Paddy went on to have an exceptional footy career, playing 217 games over 12 seasons for the Perth Demons, and playing for WA.

He was a key member of Perth's 1966, 1967, and

1968 premiership teams, earned the club's fairest and best award on two occasions, and was named as part of their 'Team of the Century'.

After an outstanding season in 1970, his second-last league season, Paddy won the Sandover Medal as the fairest and best player in the WAFL competition.

Paddy was inducted into Perth Football Club's Inaugural Hall of Fame in 2015 along with South Perth alumni, and club Patron Allan Stiles.

Well done to all Stingrays!




YEAR 6 AT OPTUS STADIUM

A group of 60 Stingrays' parents and players attended what was a great experience for all at the new stadium.





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

JOHN MCGRATH PAVILION – OUR NEW HOME

After many years of seeking an improvement to facilities at EJ Reserve, particularly its buildings, it was exciting to see the City of South Perth complete Stage One of its redevelopment at the end of 2017. This enabled the Club to move in to our new home before the 2018 season got underway.

Stage Two is now approaching completion. This has involved the demolition of buildings; works on the oval; and construction of new sports facilities such as cricket nets, playgrounds and social areas. Importantly for the Club, the lights to the ovals are being upgraded, which will allow far greater flexibility for fixturing of games and be very much welcomed by coaches and players for training.

We also expect that a shelter structure to the oval-facing side of the Pavilion will be installed prior to the start of the 2019 season.

skills, made the chemistry within our team a joy to coach. Lots of fun was had throughout the year whilst going through a huge learning curve on development in the modern game.


